

The Vicar's Letter: Creation Tide

I visited a wedding couple to talk about their imminent wedding day recently. The groom's parents were over from Rome and as I talked to the wedding couple I noticed that the groom's parents were cold which surprised me as it was approx. 20 degrees that day. When I mentioned the temperature, they replied (in Italian) "Ah, yes, but it's 40 degrees in Rome!".

Such extremes of heat are not just limited to Rome. We have heard tragic reports of people and animals dying due to extreme heat around the world. Yet behind the extreme heatwaves we are seeing more and more often, is human activity which has resulted in land, sky and sea being warmed and it's having a catastrophic effect. This is witnessed not only in extreme heatwaves but also in higher rainfall, extended droughts and tropical cyclones. Be under no allusions we are seeing an acceleration in climate change which required us all to act now!

Besides catering for the spiritual needs of the parish, All Saints hosts a choir, music group, a flower guild, Sunday school, Mother & Toddler Group, and Handicrafts Group. The Church Centre is a venue for a variety of educational and recreational interests in an active and well-integrated community.

This autumn, world leaders will gather in Glasgow for COP26 the latest United Nations conference on Climate Change. Following the Paris Agreement in 2015 where world leaders agreed to work towards reducing carbon emissions to prevent the earth's temperature rising over 2 degrees,

COP26 will face into the need to achieve greater reductions in emissions and faster; keeping increases in the earth's temperature to under 1.5 degrees.

Ahead of the conference the UN's Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) released their latest research into climate change. The report describes itself as 'a code red for humanity' noting that the past five years have been the hottest on record since the mid-19th Century. The same report suggests that human influence accounts for 90% of the retreat of Arctic glaciers.

Leading up to COP26, which takes place in early-to-mid November, the Church of England will keep the season of Creation tide from the beginning of September through to the first Sunday in October. During this season we, as a family of churches, will be grappling with these issues and praying intentionally for COP26 and the agreements required to arrest a climate catastrophe.

What lies behind this article for the Christian? God created the world in love and a place of flourishing for all human and animal kind and as a place where land, sea and sky lived in harmony with one another. That is no longer the world we live in, as climate change has disfigured God's creation. But as Christians we cling on to the heart of God for the world to be a place of flourishing and abundance for all life and that is the message, we need to be proclaiming ahead of COP26. King David wrote in Psalm 24:

'The earth is the Lord's and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it; for he founded it on the seas and established it on the waters. 'Psalm 24:1-2

The Ringwood PCC, at it's July meeting, grasped the importance of this Parish playing a part in caring for the environment in our local

communities. The meeting resolved to:

Register as an 'Eco-Church with A Rocha and encourage each church in the Parish to work towards their bronze Eco-Award.

Establish a PCC sub-committee called the Eco-Pods to champion our engagements with environmental issues.

For an 'Environmental update' to be a standing item on every PCC agenda, reflecting the significance of this issue.

For us all, however, our individual care of creation, must become a central part of what it means for us to be followers of Jesus Christ, as central as the disciplines of prayer and other spiritual disciplines. In honouring creation, we honour the creator. As you reflect on this issue further, you might find the following prayer helpful:

You spoke into the silence Light suffusing darkness. You spoke into the silence Blowing clean life giving air into the space

You spoke into the silence Warmth and cold infusing the air You spoke into the silence Solid ground formed out of gushing water.

You spoke voice carrying over the sound

People, plants and animals came to life.

You spoke each creation balanced against the next so life would be abundant and sustainable.



We meet on the second Tuesday of the month (except August), at The Main Hall, Braeside Village Hall, at 2.30 p.m. New members and visitors always welcome.



Sunday 20th June was a sad day for us within the Benefice, and most particularly for us at All Saints, St Leonards and St Ives, as we said goodbye to our much loved lan Whitham, his lovely wife Lianne, and his family, Wesley, Joshua and Amy. When the Benefice was formed in 2017, Ian became our Associate Minister, and he has spent most of his time since then among us, while living at the Vicarage in Pine Drive. He soon immersed himself in the local community, becoming a Governor at St Ives school, led many of the school assemblies, and forged a relationship with the school, its staff and its pupils that continues to develop and grow to this day. He and Lianne joined the local St Ives Club in their personal capacity, and became regulars at their social events, and so became the "face" of our church in that place. Ian introduced us to new concepts for Church, for services, for the way forward, for moving our church out into our local community. Not always an easy concept to embrace, but one which we must at some time face?

When Covid struck the country in March 2020, church life as we had known it changed beyond recognition, All Saints church closed, and the clergy were forced to "think outside the box". THE NEW NORMAL: COVID 19 Precautions In Church

These measures were agreed by the Vicar and PCC following the release of guidance from the Church of England. We will continue to err on the side of caution and to be mindful of the current increase in case numbers. The Vicar and PCC understand and respect that as of the 19th July, decisions on the wearing of face masks and social distancing are no longer requirements in law but determined by individuals. The provisions which follow are our best attempt based on HM Government and Church of England guidance to promote safe churches where people can pray, worship and take part in activities with confidence. All of these measures will be reviewed in the autumn.

- ② We will maintain social distancing in pews except for large services including weddings, baptism and funerals which will be assessed on an individual basis and steps taken based on the number of attendees expected and the capacity of the church. In this case individuals must then take personal responsibility for their own safety.
- ② We will provide cards for congregation members to place on the pew next to them, if they wish to do so, so that no one else sits there.
- ② We will encourage the use of face masks when moving about the church. These can be removed when seated.
- ② Singing in church is now allowed and we will do so, but ask people to still wear a mask if possible.
- Holy Communion will remain in one kind only until at least the autumn.
- Test & Trace forms and QR codes are now no longer compulsory. However, we will retain them and would appreciate cooperation to continue providing details from church attendees, but no one will be compelled.
- ☑ The Peace will remain non-contact as now. ☑ Cleaning will return to prepandemic levels.

A weekly co-ordinator takes the calls and finds a volunteer driver to take the client to the appointment, wait for them, and return the client to his/her home afterwards. No charge is made for this service, although donations are welcomed to help cover the drivers' petrol costs. 48 hours notice is required to allow for finding a suitable driver.

Volunteer Befriending Scheme is a FREE service introduced recently to help those in the community who would benefit from some help or some company, as and when needed. Clients will be

from some help or some company, as and when needed. Clients will be visited to discuss their needs and try to match them with a volunteer, who may be needed on a regular or occasional basis.

All the volunteers are Police checked and have identification available for clients to see, if they so wish.

Understanding Investments: Planning to retire within the next ten years?



God in the Sciences

Written by Dr Ruth M Bancewicz, who is Church Engagement Director at The Faraday Institute for Science and Religion in Cambridge. Ruth writes on the positive relationship between Science and Christian faith.

Faithful to Scripture, Faithful to Science: Alister McGrath on science and Christian faith

Alister McGrath is wellknown as a theologian, but he started out as a scientist. After becoming a Christian as a student. he wanted to learn about his new faith so he studied theology at the same time as completing his PhD in molecular biophysics. He has not lost touch with science. but has continued to write and speak about how science and Christian faith work together. In this extract from a recently released interview, he shares his experience of being a scientist and a Christian.

"I think my most vivid experience of wonder took place in the 1970's when I was on vacation in Iran. We were travelling on a bus in the middle of the night because it wasn't hot then, and the bus broke down. We found ourselves in the middle of this solemn black desert, and the night sky shone with a brilliance like I had never seen before. That just overwhelmed me, it made me think there is something really wonderful here.

"Now, I was a Christian by that time and I knew how Christianity could answer that but it just struck me, that sense of wonder has two possible outcomes. One is science - this universe is wonderful, what's it all about? But of course, it is also about religion, the deeper levels of things that science can't really engage. I think one of the things I have discovered over time is that maybe this sense of wonder both opens the gateway to science and to faith, and that those two together are able to answer questions which on their own they simply couldn't.

"I think science is wonderful at asking questions. Some of those questions can be answered, but very often when you do answer them, they simply open up yet more questions. But of course,

there are some more fundamental questions I think science simply cannot answer - they transcend its capacities to answer, and you might think of non-empirical questions like, 'Why am I here? What is the meaning of life? What is good and how do I live a good life?'

"These are real questions and they're good questions but they're not scientific questions. And

the psychologists tell us that we really need answers to those questions if we are to lead a fulfilled human existence. You find some scientists who say, 'Well because science can't answer them there are no answers to be given', but actually most realise that there are answers waiting to be discovered - it's just that science can't deliver them.

"Science fills in part of a big picture but there are parts of the picture you have to fill in from somewhere else. Science is part of the answer but only part, and faith supplements it, giving us a vision of life that is exciting and reliable, and also something that we can inhabit meaningfully."


