

MINISTER'S LETTER

Revd Ian Whitham

FINAL WORDS

As you all know, on the 30th of June 2021 I will no longer be the Associate Minister of the Ringwood Benefice. In fact, due to the Winchester Diocese pastoral reorganisation this post will no longer exist after that date.

It feels strange to write this as I cannot believe how quickly the last four years have gone since I arrived here in 2017. I also cannot believe how much has happened in those four years, including a pandemic.

It has been a roller-coaster ride at times, there have been good moments and difficult moments I guess like any parish ministry. However, the highlight for me has been getting to know you all over the years. I can honestly say you have been so encouraging. I really cannot remember how many times people have supported and encouraged me, I just know it is a lot of times.

I am going to miss you all very much, though I am sure I will pop in from time to time. Nevertheless, I am so grateful to you all for allowing me to journey with you over the last four years. I am sure that it was not easy at first, having to inherit an Associate Minister but you all embraced me with generosity and kindness of heart.



I want you all to know that you will always be in my prayers and thoughts, and I am sure under Matthew's and the rest of the benefice leadership you will go from strength to strength as we emerge from COVID-19.

As for me and what is the next part of my journey all I can say as I write is I have no idea! That said as I am currently getting ready for an interview for a job in a few days' time and I am continuing to apply for different posts. I am sure that God will open a door somewhere hopefully soon, and once again thank you all your prayers encouragements in this particular area. It has not been easy, as you can imagine for myself and my family it feels like the future is on hold at the moment.

So, what final words of wisdom can I give to you? Well, I could say things like never judge a book by its cover, or never send an email in anger. Or quote to you from the book of proverbs or a quote

from the beatitudes, or some wise words that Jesus spoke in the gospels. Or I could even tell you all a joke, like the chicken and the frog one which I've never told you. Maybe I will do a short video of it and put it up on my Facebook page one day, it will make you smile. Though I do feel I need to share a wise quote I received from Rev Michael Anderson just the other day which is, "Life can only be understood backwards; but it must be lived forwards". Like that one.

However, what I really want to say is this, keep your eyes firmly fixed upon Jesus Christ and fully put your trust in him. In life things can and do go wrong. People will let you down, organisations and institutions will let you down, that's just life, but Jesus will never let you down. We may let Him down at times, but He will never fail you. I say this as someone who has been a Christian for more than 40 years. I am always reminded of that famous poem, Footsteps in the Sand when things are difficult in life, because in moments like that we will often ask the question, "Where is God?" and God says, "I'm right here with you." As that poem demonstrates he is in fact carrying us.

So that is it everyone, my last magazine article, God bless.



Generosity is a key part of our discipleship and walk with God; through the available resources, we are encouraging everyone to reflect on their own position on generosity and see how it can affect their day to day lives.

CURATE CORNER

Sam has asked me to write a few thoughts for a new spot in the Link magazine ... 'Curate's Corner'. Of course, soon, Ringwood Benefice will have two curates, Sandra will be ordained as a Deacon on July 4th and I will be ordained as a Priest the day before. So what brings us to this place of ordination?

Well, I can't speak for Sandra, but I can talk a little about my calling. I believe that God has a calling for each of us to use what we have to reflect His glory and draw others into the knowledge and love of God. Each of us loved, created and known by God, which we read in Psalm 139. We have different gifts and skills that are shaped and moulded by our genetics, our personality, our circumstances and our life experience. One of my favourite bible verses is Ephesians 2:8-10 'God saved you by his grace when you believed. And you can't take credit for this; it is a gift from God. Salvation is not a reward for the good things we have done, so none of us can boast about it. For we are God's masterpiece. He has created us anew in Christ Jesus, so we can do the good things he planned for us long ago.' In this passage we read that God saves us by grace, our faith is not about how good we are, but that Jesus transforms us by His grace, and we are re-created to do the good things that God planned for us to do.

I wonder what good things God plans for you to do?

I often find that the things I feel passionate about, the things I long for and the needs of people around me, are

the very same things that God places in me and stirs me to get involved in. In my last Parish, I was aware that we had no children's or youth leader, and because I enjoyed the work and thought it was really important to have someone lead our children's and young people's work. I was encouraged by some friends to take on the paid role for a year and found that I loved working with children and young people, their joy and energy was infectious and I loved learning about our faith together, that most times I would learn from their simple faith about who God is and what is valuable to Him.

As a Mum, I recognised that some people in our village were isolated and lonely. I enjoyed the company of a friend who was training to be a counsellor, so I decided I wanted to learn how to listen better to others. This took me on a journey of exploring counselling and mental health, realising that wholeness and reconciliation are at the heart of the gospel, that Jesus came to bring life to us in all fullness, that Jesus wants to bring healing and restoration to us and our world.

What gifts and skills has God placed inside you? What yearnings, longings and passions do you see and feel for yourself and those around you? God is calling you to use what you have, like the young boy's loaves and fish, which God blesses and uses to feed others around you? As you wonder about this question, 'What good things has God plans for you to do?' I would be really happy to listen and pray with you. A LETTER FROM BISHOP DEBBIE

Dear Friends,

I wanted to contact you all directly with an important update. Bishop Tim has today informed me that he will be stepping back from his role as Bishop of Winchester for the next six weeks, so that he can focus on discussions about future leadership and governance reform in the Diocese. I fully support his decision. Bishop Tim and Lambeth Palace have requested that, over this period, I temporarily take responsibility for the Diocese and I shall be working with the Wolvesey to ensure team at full continuity.

I realise that, even before today's news this has been an enormously challenging 15 months for us all as a diocese and as a church - as it has been for the entire country. On behalf of Bishop Tim and the team, I wanted to thank you once again for all you have been doing for your parishes and your communities, in such trying circumstances. As the country begins to emerge tentatively from the

long shadow of COVID-19, our anticipation continues to be tempered, by necessary caution. We will, of course, continue to be led by Government and National Church of England guidance, so that we can all stay as safe as possible.

Finally, during these next weeks, every Monday morning at 9am from 24th May, I will be offering Diocesan Prayer on Zoom, with the exception of the Bank Holiday. You are very welcome to join me if you would like to do so.

29TH JUNE: ST PETER & ST PAUL

ST PETER

St Peter (d.c. 64AD), was originally called Simon. Jesus gave him the name of Cephas (Peter) which means rock.

A WITNESS

He was one of the three apostles who were privileged to witness the Transfiguration, the raising of the daughter of Jairus, and the Agony in the Garden.

THE ROCK

Jesus told Peter that he would be the rock on which His Church would be built, that the 'gates of hell' would never prevail against it. Peter and the apostles would have the power of 'binding and loosing', but Peter would be personally given 'the keys of the kingdom of heaven'.

FORWARNED

Jesus forewarned Peter of his betrayal and subsequent strengthening of the other apostles. After His Resurrection, Jesus appeared to Peter before the other apostles, and later entrusted him with the mission to feed both the lambs and the sheep of Christ's flock.

ST PAUL

Paul (d.c. 65) originally called Saul.

A PERSECUTOR

So keen was he to defend the god of his fathers that he became a persecutor of Christianity, and even took part in the stoning of Stephen. He hunted Christians down and imprisoned them

DAMASCUS

While on his way to persecute
Christians in Damascus he was
suddenly given his vision of Christ.

It was the decisive moment of Paul's life
– Paul suddenly realised that Jesus was
truly the Messiah, and the Son of God,
and that He was calling Paul to bring
the Christian faith to the Gentiles

MISSIONARY

Paul made great missionary journeys and lived a life full of hazard and hardship. He was martyred in Rome during the persecution of Nero. He was a great thinker. His epistles played a major part in the later development of Christian theology.

20TH JUNE FATHERS' DAY A TIME TO CELEBRATE MALE ROLE MODELS

In the UK, USA and Canada, the third Sunday in June is Father's Day. Father's Day began because in 1909 there was a woman in Spokane, Washington, named Sonora Louise Smart Dodd. That year she heard a church sermon about the merits of setting aside a day to honour one's mother. Mother's Day was just beginning to gather widespread attention in the United States at this time. But Sonora Louise Smart Dodd knew that it was her father who had selflessly raised herself and her five siblings by himself after their mother had died in childbirth. So the sermon on mothers gave Sonora Louise the idea to petition for a day to honour fathers, and in particular, her own father, William Jackson Smart.

Sonora Louise soon set about planning the first Father's Day celebration in Spokane in 1910. With support from the Spokane Ministerial Association and the YMCA, her efforts paid off, and a 'Father's Day' was appointed. Sonora Louise had wanted Father's Day to be on the first Sunday in June (since that was her father's birthday), but the city council didn't have time to approve it until later in the month. And so on 19th June, 1910, the first Father's Day was celebrated in Spokane.

Gradually, other people in other cities caught on and started celebrating their fathers, too. The rose was selected as the official Father's Day flower. Some people began to wear a white rose to honour a father who was dead, and a red one to honour a father who was living. Finally, in 1972, President Richard Nixon signed a presidential proclamation declaring the third Sunday of June as Father's Day - a permanent, national holiday.

This camp is built on friendship, community and faith and is held at Hilfield Friary so draws on the Franciscan tradition.




