Goal 3



MINISTER'S LETTER

CREATION TIDE

I visited a wedding couple to talk about their imminent wedding day recently. The groom's parents were over from Rome and as I talked to the wedding couple I noticed that the groom's parents were cold which surprised me as it was approx. 20 degrees that day. When I mentioned the temperature, they replied (in Italian) "Ah, yes, but it's 40 degrees in Rome!".

Such extremes of heat are not just limited to Rome we have heard tragic reports of people and animals dying due to extreme heat around the world. Yet behind the extreme heatwaves we are seeing more and more often, is human activity which has resulted in land, sky and sea being warmed and it's having a catastrophic effect. This is witnessed not only in extreme heatwaves, but also in higher rainfall, extended droughts and tropical cyclones. Be under no illusions we are seeing an acceleration in climate change which required us all to act now!

This autumn, world leaders will gather in Glasgow for COP26, the latest United Nations conference on Climate Change. Following the Paris Agreement in 2015, where world leaders agreed to work towards reducing carbon emissions to prevent the earth's temperature rising over 2 degrees, COP26 will face into the need to achieve greater reductions in emissions and faster; keeping increases in the earth's temperature to under 1.5



degrees.

Ahead of the conference the UN's Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) released their latest research into climate change. The report describes itself as 'a code red for humanity' noting that the past five years have been the hottest on record since the mid-19th Century. The same report suggests that human influence accounts for 90% of the retreat of Artic glaciers.

Leading up to COP26 which takes place in early-to-mid November, the Church of England will keep the season of Creation tide from the beginning of September through to the first Sunday in October. During this season we, as a family of churches, will be grappling with these issues and praying intentionally for COP26 and the agreements required to arrest a climate catastrophe.

What lies behind this article for the Christian? God created the world in love and a place of flourishing for all human

and animal kind and as a place where land, sea and sky lived in harmony with one another. That is no longer the world we live in, as climate change has disfigured God's creation. But as Christians we cling on to the heart of God for the world to be a place of flourishing and abundance for all life and that is the message, we need to be proclaiming ahead of COP26. King David wrote in Psalm 24:

The earth is the Lord's and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it; for he founded it on the seas and established it on the waters. 'Psalm 24:1-2

The PCC at its July meeting grasped the importance of this Parish playing a part in caring for the environment in our local communities. The PCC resolved to:

- Register as an Eco-Church with A Rocha and encourage each church in the Parish to work towards their bronze Eco-Award.
- Establish a PCC sub-committee called the Eco-Pods to champion our engagements with environmental issues.
- For an 'Environmental update' to be a standing item on every PCC agenda, reflecting the significance of this issue.

For us all, however, our individual care of creation must become a central part of what it means for us to be followers of Jesus Christ, as central as the disciplines of prayer and other spiritual disciplines. In honouring creation, we honour the creator.

As you reflect on this issue further, you might find the following prayer helpful:

You spoke into the silence
Light suffusing darkness.
You spoke into the silence
Blowing clean life giving air into the space
You spoke into the silence
Warmth and cold infusing the air
You spoke into the silence
Solid ground formed out of gushing
water.

You spoke voice carrying over the sound People, plants and animals came to life. You spoke each creation balanced against the next so life would be abundant and sustainable.

You saw everything you had made and declared it to be very good.

You spoke choosing to give us humans stewardship over all that You had made.

We speak and act

Darkness of pollution limits light levels and damages the air we breathe.

We speak and act

Ground poisoned, burnt, stripped bare.

We speak and act

Spoiling, limiting, destroying quality of life and life itself.

We speak and act

Without hearing Your call over the noise of the world to be good stewards.

You speak. You create. You want us to be stewards of Your creation.

We come to You to re-learn how to care for the earth and people you have made.



THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE 9.30 COMMUNITY

As part of my work here while training, Matthew asked me to develop one of our goals, to create a new worshipping community, and space had been created at 9.30am on a Sunday morning to allow a new community to flourish.

In early 2021 during the lockdown, a group of us - Matthew, Peter Vargeson, Kevin Jones, along with Abbi and Luke (our Moorlands students) - met a few times to pray and discuss ideas on Zoom. Through listening to God in prayer we felt that we did not want to rush into a 'service' but to form a community built around some simple principles and values;

- Invitation, welcome & hospitality
- Openness to God's leading through prayer
- Being a community built on relationship, by journeying and learning together
- Serving the community listening to where God is already at work, bringing His life and hope in the wider community.

Since our first meeting at the end of April, we have been discerning as a community what it looks like to 'be' the people of God in this place and time, as well as being open and wanting to invite others. We wanted to focus on gathering people together as a community meeting with God, rather than coming to church for a service. From this vision, the idea of a 9.30am 'prayer gathering' was birthed.

Initially we were meeting every other week, but that became quite confusing for people so started to meet weekly from June. We have been prayer walking around the town, had breakfast outside the church, met in Luna coffee shop, held services on the Bickerley, and at Ellingham, but most of the time, we have been based in the Lady Chapel.

It's still very early days, of 'forming' what this community is and will be. We are looking towards forming a pattern of 'being community' and we are currently thinking about what it means to be 'gathered servants' and 'scattered servants'.

As gathered servants, we will meet for informal services, to worship, pray and encounter God, to learn together and to encourage one another in our gifts. As scattered servants, we will be thinking more about where God has placed us as part of our community, where is He at work and where is He leading us to follow Him.

We will mostly be meeting at St Peter and St Paul at 9.30am, although some times we will be meeting outside the building. If you want to find out more, do come along or get in touch with Kay Pead, you are very welcome.

One of my tasks as your Church Warden is to ensure that your Church is kept in a

good state of repair and that we are conforming to all health and safety regulations. Over the past few weeks, I have been reading up on our old files and have had the opportunity to discuss the repair and maintenance of Harbridge Church with our architect Mr Columba Cook who has recently completed our quinquennial report, which Di Norman's committee has had copies of. There is a long list of matters requiring attention, some urgent to be completed in the next six months and other matters over the foreseeable future. All this is of course going to cost money and thanks to you all and particularly Di Norman and her committee we have money in the bank, but there is a process to be gone through regarding the work ranging from getting quotations to the necessary permissions from the church authorities before I can begin.

To cheer you all up, Anne Craft who as you will know is so supportive, and a faithful sidesman (others are Vanessa Linda and Jane Thomas) is very kindly holding an afternoon of Classic Jazz, featuring Tim Eyles and his Mardi Gras Band in her field on Saturday, September 4th starting at 3.30 pm – 6.30 pm.
